There were no comments on items not on today's agenda.

Karwowski noted today's presentations were submitted to Committee members prior to today's meeting. He reviewed the materials to be used to evaluate and score the presentations. Karwowski noted the recusal process should any Committee member feel they have a conflict of interest.

Of the 40 Letters of Interest received, 32 applications were qualified to be reviewed. Applicants for six of those were asked to submit in a different grant cycle and four were deemed not to be "preferred investments" benefitting the public. Twenty-two applications are moving through the process.

Karwowski explained how the TOT and CAP allocations will be differentiated. The two Committees have some overlap on guiding documents, but there may be different priorities. He reviewed the total dollars requested and forecasts for what will be available during the three year sponsorship cycle being considered.

b. Presentation of Sponsorship projects and programs recommended for TOT/CAP committee review and scoring.

Project proponents presented requests as follows, including details of the project, the budget, the funding requested over the three year sponsorship period, the funding "match," and how it aligns with identified priorities. Staff explained the primary and secondary funding source for each which impacts whether TOT or CAP considers the project. Applicants answered questions clarifying the request. If additional information was request, it will be submitted to staff within the next week.

Lease to Locals (Placer County

Tuma recused himself from this presentation.

Emily Setzer described the program that offers cash incentives to east Placer County homeowners renting to local workers for a minimum of five months. The program has been in place since August 1, 2022.

Dollar Creek Crossing (Placer County)

Paul Breckenridge, Deputy Director of Placer County Facilities Management presented the \$2.5 million request for development and funding of this housing project. There was a brief discussion regarding the earning parameters required to qualify for the variety of housing units. The Committees asked for additional information on requirements and the overall plan.

Workforce Housing Preservation Program (Placer county)

Nikki Streegan described the program that offers down payment assistance to new homebuyers in exchange for a 55-year deed restriction that the property can only house local workers.

There was a question about the timeframe a match can be applicable, given Placer County has had this program in place for a few years.

Sierra Community House Workforce Housing Advocacy and Direct Assistance (Placer County)

Paul Bancroft described what Sierra Community House is and the programs and services they offer. This request is specific to housing.

Chalet Blanc (Land to Living)

Ryan recused himself from this presentation.

Molly Olson presented plans to include workforce housing with their building plans. There was a question about whether or not prevailing wage would be required if TOT dollars are used in the project.

RTTP 1C Parking Management Program (Placer County)

Rebecca Taber described the overall Resort Triangle Transportation Plan (RTTP), design to achieve TRPA and Placer County environmental goals in the basin. The Parking Management Plan is one component to reduce traffic congestion in the town centers and encourage people to use public transit, carpool, bike, or walk when possible.

Given the other requests for addressing the RTTP, Casey reminded the group to consider the projects in the larger context and the relationship between them to produce the most effective results.

RTTP 1A – SR 89 & SR 267 Adaptive Corridor Management (Placer County)

Ryan Decker presented the pilot programs to install HOV lanes on SR 89 and SR 267. He noted the other agencies involved in the program. State and federal dollars are also being requested.

RTTP 1B – TART Connect Expanded Service (Placer County)

Jamie Wright presented the request to expand TART Connect service in the three North Tahoe zones.

Kings Beach Western Approach (Placer County)

Andy Deinken reviewed the project that includes a roundabout at SR 28 and SR 267 and wider sidewalks in the area as part of the Complete Street Corridor, designed to improve safety and mobility for bicyclists and pedestrians. This component finalizes the Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project.

Tahoe City Downtown Access Improvements (Placer County)

Andy Deinken explained that in addition to the expansion of the Grove Street parking lot, this project implements much of the Tahoe City Mobility Plan including improving pedestrian access to businesses in Tahoe City and reducing vehicular congestion. There is a grant available for CFI charging stations, but it does require a match.

Tahoe City Park & Ride 64 Acre Snow Removal (TNT TMA)

Van Siclen recused herself

Van Siclen presented the request for funding to plow the 64 Acre parking lot and rent a porta-otie and a dumpster, which is owned by USFS, to expand the Park & Ride service;;; she noted the past Park & Ride shuttles to Palisades, very successful using TC Transit Center, but there was not enough parking for all those wanting to use the program;;;;wld be open for other high volume days that wld benefit TART use;;;;;;;cld also help given Palisades wil be implementing reserved parking

;REVIEWED the request for \$54,789 in yr 1, \$55,181 in yr 2, and \$55,588 in yr 3;;;increased costs mainly due to anticipated inflation......

DISCUSSON on logistics.....and Palisades involvement.....

Washoe Van Pool (TNT TMA)

Van Siclen recused herself

VAN SICLEN: reviewed details of the program to provide a commute alternative for those living in Washoe County and working in Placer County;;;proposing 20 vanpools serving approx 80 – 280 commuters daily;;; noted Washoe RTC match of \$400 per vanpool per month for trips beginning or ending in Washoe County;;;;Enterprise provides the service and it includes insurance as well as other support;;;;;riders wld provide \$800 in subsidy from Placer and \$400 from Washoe..traffic reduction, VMT, thousands of trips saved over three years, and reduced environmental impacts, based on current RTC Smart Trips program to Hyatt;;;;;;

How does this coordinate with airport shuttle? VAN SICLEN: driver for van pool will be a commuting employee after some training so van will remain here........Use private vans??? Hmmm....
