1.0 CALL TO ORDER - ESTABLISH QUORUM

1.1 The Membership Advisory Committee meeting was called to order at 9:14 am by Chair Caroline Ross and a quorum was established.

2.0 PUBLIC FORUM

2.1 The committee introduced themselves and welcomed new committee member John Crus.

3.0 AGENDA AMENDMENTS AND APPROVAL

3.1 The Membership Advisory Committee accepted the agenda by acclamation.

4.0 APPROVAL OF THE MEETING MINUTES

M/S/C (Doyle/Young) (7-0-0) to approve the Membership Advisory Committee minutes of February 8, 2012.

5.0 MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM AND PROJECT UPDATES- KYM FABEL

- 5.1 Kym updated the committee about the March 13, 2012 time management seminar. The Small Business Development Center and Plums Bank are offering the Chamber Members and Business Associations an educational business series. These classes begin on March 20, 2012.
- 5.2 The NLT Chamber/CVB/Resort Assn. has partnered with Senator Gaines, Citizens Against Frivolous Lawsuits, and Jennifer Montgomery to conduct an ADA Compliance class. The class will be recorded and the DVD will be available to check out from the Chamber of Commerce for free. The power point slides of the presentation will also be available for download on the Chamber website.

ACTION: Kym will look into putting the ADA seminar on YouTube.

6.0 RETAIL SALES COORDINATION

6.1 Sandy suggested there be a community wide sales day for local vendors to get rid of excess inventory at the end of the season. Mike Young and Joy Doyle mentioned the shop local program members had discussed previously using the program for a spring sale. Karen Wilcuts, from the Tahoe City Downtown Association (TCDA), mentioned that the TCDA already arranges a local Labor Day sidewalk sale. She suggested that all of the business associations work together to promote a larger, wider-ranging event.

Kali Kopley proposed that Memorial Day would be a good time to conduct the sidewalk sale. Sandy recapped the discussion and said that Memorial Day could be a "Spring-Fling Clean" event, the Labor Day would be a "Sidewalk Sale" event, and "Shop Local" would be from the fall to the end of the year. Kay Williams, Mike Young, and Caroline Ross volunteered to work with Sandy and the Membership Department to get the message out about these retail sales events.

Kym Fabel noted that there are many events in the area that generate an overflow of participants. She suggested that the business associations look into having a booth at some of these events. The committee expressed interest n expanding our exposure, dependent upon the type of event and area it is in.

ACTION: Sandy will coordinate the messaging and encourage participation of retail sales events.

7.0 DISCUSSION AND WORKSHOP: COMMUNITY WIDE CALENDAR OF EVENTS

- 7.1 Caroline Ross discussed the idea of creating a community wide calendar to stop overlapping and repeating efforts of local business associations.
- 7.2 Members from different business associations are contributing events to a community calendar put together by Kym Fabel. Associations were encouraged to continue to share calendars so there will be no conflicts or duplications.

ACTION: Emily will collect reoccurring event information for the creation of a long-range 3-year community calendar.

ACTION: Kym will send the committee members an electronic version of the community calendar.

8.0 AUTUMN FOOD & WINE / FABULOUS FALL / CULINARY THEME

- 8.1 Judy Laverty-Capach will be promoting the "Fabulous Fall Festival" that runs from Labor Day through Thanksgiving weekend. The business associations were asked to host culinary events and list them on the GoTahoeNorth.com website.
- 8.2 Judy mentioned the aim is to position Tahoe in the fall as a "culinary destination." These events would include wine maker dinners, tasting events, and other food events. There will be a request to each community to host activities to make the Fabulous Fall Festival basin-wide.

ACTION: Judy Laverty-Capach will get together with the heads of the business associations about Fabulous Fall Festival events.

ACTION: Judy Laverty-Capach will send the committee the list of signature events.

9.0 PROMOTION OPPORTUNITIES WITH NLTRA/CHAMBER -SANDY/KYM

9.1 The Official Visitors Guide encompasses the basin area and will be put together by Tahoe Quarterly. The plan is for the guide to be available June 1, 2012. The guide will be left in hotel rooms, lobbies, etc. The Official Visitors Guide does not replace the Vacation Planner; it is still distributed at trade shows and outside the area.

- 9.2 The NLT Chamber/CVB/Resort Assn. will be opening the new Tahoe City Visitors Center in the Porters building and it will open June 1, 2012. The Visitors Center will have a library lounge, retail items, and promote local businesses and locally made products.
- 9.3 The Chamber website will be moving to the Gotahoenorth.com website and will be using new software (WebLinx) that will offer many benefits to the Chamber members.
- 9.4 The NLT Chamber/CVB/Resort Assn. may be reaching out to our business community to offer cool deals around well attended events (i.e. Street Vibrations, Reno Rodeo, ect.) in an effort to attract more people to the North Lake Tahoe area.

FACT SHEET: STATE ROUTE 431 / STATE ROUTE 28 ROUNDABOUT AND EROSION CONTROL PROJECTS

WHAT

The Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) commences work on April 1 on a three-part project near Incline Village, Nev. that includes construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Mount Rose Highway (SR431) and state Route 28 (SR28), as well as erosion control and water clarity improvements from the same intersection northwest to Crystal Bay and from the summit of Mount Rose to the intersection at SR28. The work is scheduled to be complete by the end of 2013, rather than 2016 as originally planned, thanks to a modified, 24-hour work schedule by Q&D Construction for portions of the project.

In addition to the increased work schedule, the erosion control and roundabout projects are estimated to bring 125 jobs to workers in Washoe County including employees of Q&D Construction, NDOT, project consultants and subcontractors. Funding for the project comes from a combination of state and federal funds including the Tahoe Bond Act and the Highway Safety Improvement Program. Topping off the project is a piece of local artwork, set to be featured in the center of the roundabout at SR431/28.

WHY

The erosion control work being performed on state Routes 431 and 28 is designed to capture storm water runoff and filter out sediment before it reaches Lake Tahoe, improving the Lake's water clarity and quality. The program is part of the Lake Tahoe Clarity Challenge, which is a call by local, state and federal agencies to reverse the clarity decline at Lake Tahoe and increase it to nearly 80 feet by 2025. The new filtration and catch basin system has the capacity to capture up to 400 tons of sediment annually. Currently, no sediment is being deterred from entering Lake Tahoe.

While the installation of a roundabout at the intersection of SR431 and SR28 is aimed at improving safety for all those on the road, it also hopes to ease congestion at the intersection during peak traffic periods in the summer and winter months.

WHO

Sparks, Nevada-based Q&D Construction is completing the roundabout and erosion control work on behalf of the NDOT. Q&D Construction specializes in commercial building, general engineering, custom mill working and public infrastructure projects. Founded in Sparks, Nev. in 1964, Q&D is a 12-time winner of the "Top General Contractor" award by the Nevada Chapter of the Associated General Contractors. The roundabout at the intersection of SR431/28 was designed and engineered by the NDOT.

SCHEDULE

Work on the roundabout at the intersection of SR431/28 and erosion control begins April 1, 2012 and is scheduled to be complete by the end of 2013, three years ahead of the originally-planned, five-year schedule.


