#### 1. Call to Order – Establish Quorum

1. The Membership Advisory Committee meeting was called to order at 9:06 am by Chair Kay Williams and a quorum was established.

#### 2. Public Forum

#### 3. Agenda Amendments and Approval

M/S/C (Kopley/Thaler) (6-0-0) to approve the Membership Advisory Committee minutes of May 9, 2012.

#### 4. Approval of the Meeting Minutes

M/S/C (Gelbman/Young) (6-0-0) to approve the Membership Advisory Committee minutes of May 9, 2012.

#### 5. CEO Update

- 1. Sandy Evans Hall gave an update on the new Visitor Center. It is now open and the conference room this meeting is in is available to rent out.
- 2. Sandy also discussed the IRONMAN Contract that is in the works. There should be an announcement in the next week or so. The contract is for a 5-year time frame. She then gave overview of the course. There will be about 2500 participants each traveling with about 4 guests and initial thoughts are that they will be staying 5-6 nights.

#### 6. Squaw Valley Business Association 2011/12 Grant presentation (Motion)

1. Becky Moore, SVBA, gave a grant presentation for a new Squaw Valley Map. SVBA is 8 different entities, 6 lodging, Squaw Valley and Squaw Village. The project is a new map designed to emulate the Go Tahoe North map. The map design has already been completed by Sandbox Studios

and first half of the printing will be starting this week. They are requesting an additional \$10,000 to complete the printing and distribution of the map. This will include a summer and winter distribution plan and collateral for wedding planners. The map will include everyone, even businesses that are not part of SVBA.

#### 7. Tahoe City Downtown Association 2011/12 Grant presentation - Steve Hoch (17:55)

Steve Hoch, TCDA, gave his grant presentation for the TCDA. He discussed the grant money received last year and the return on investment (ROI). He then gave an update on how last years grant money was spent, Capitol Public Radio, print, Sierra Sun, TC walking Map, and special events and promotions.

Moving forward they would like to spend more of the grant money on events, 55%. The requested funding of up to \$10,000 will be spent on signage, collateral, pr, web, Facebook, print advertising, radio advertising, and some TV advertising.

#### 8. Membership Program and Project Updates - Deanna

- 1. Deanna Frumenti, Membership Manager, gave an update on upcoming Membership Activities
  - June 14, Mixer at Porter-Simon, 5-7pm
  - June 15, Greek Glendi at Mourelatos Lakeside Resort
  - The Business Expo will be rescheduled in the fall due to so many other events going on during the end of June
  - June 26, ChamberEd class, "Learning to Network" prior to the Tuesday Bluesdays mixer in Squaw
  - June 26, Tuesday Bluesdays Kickoff, joint mixer with the Truckee Chamber and SVBA.
  - 2. Deanna then gave a recap on the Opening Day at the Lake promotion. It was primarily Chamber members and North Tahoe Business Association members who participated. While it was a great first attempt there are certainly some things to improve on. Some ideas include starting earlier, creating a domain, and encouraging more participation from the business associations. Specifically it would be nice to get more retail participation.

The comments from the committee members echoed Deanna's recap with starting promotion to business owners earlier being the most important thing for next year. Some other comments included offering incentives for participating and sending out a "save the date" as soon as possible.

#### 9. Presentation: Expanded Night Rider Service/ Water Shuttle Update

1. Ron Treabess, NLTRA, gave a brief report on summer transportation. He explained the increase in service during the busy summer season. He also talked about the North Lake Tahoe Express and how they are revising route times and way that we pay operator. We will now be collecting revenue and paying the operator a set fee. The other change is in Night Rider. In past it has been provided by three operators, TART, Airport Mini Bus and Northstar. One goal is to establish identifiable bus and this year there will be just two operators, Airport Mini Bus and Northstar. This summer it was decided to experiment with running the shuttle later in the evening. Steve Hoch and other establishment owners approached the Board with request to extend even later, until 2am. The business owners have put forward some of there own money and are requesting funding from the Board for up to \$10,000. Hopefully the program will be approved and the shuttle will be a great success.

2. Ron also discussed water shuttle project. Its been in the works and discussed for years. There is money is in place from TOT dollar to support this program for three years. TRPA permitting is in place for a temporary 2-year permit. Boat operator contract is in place and could be signed today. There will be four docks for this summer, The West Shore Cafe, Tahoe City Marina, Garwoods, and the Tahoe Vista boat launch. The shuttle is "bus service" and will do 5-6 loops a day and the boat carries up to 12 passengers and racks for up to 10 bikes. Paddleboards will also fit. Service will be beginning around July 20<sup>th</sup> and run through the end of September. Cost of tickets will be around \$7-10. The purpose of the shuttle is alternate transportation during busy time of day. It also provides an opportunity for more people to get out on the lake.

#### 10. Committee Member Reports/Updates from Community

1. Kay Williams asked for help with West Shore Jazz in the Park at Sugar Pine Park on September 8th. They need to provide shuttles for the event and are looking to borrow some shuttles for the day. They also need volunteers for the event.

#### 11. Standing Reports

- 1. Dave Snyder, Placer County, announced the new placer county CEO, Dave Boesch. He was unanimously approved yesterday by the Board of Supervisors yesterday. He will start Monday and everyone is excited and lucky to have him.
- 2. Dave said that both him and Deanna have spoke with Bill Brigs, the owner of the old Placer County building on the West Shore. He is looking to sell his property and we would like to assist with either finding him a buyer or a tenant.
- 3. Dave mentioned that there is an event coming up in Loomis, the Content Creation and Distribution Expo. It's a great event for people in digital/media world.
- 4. Dave also announced the meeting of the Gold Country Broadband on 21<sup>st</sup> in north Auburn. The group is working to bring better Internet to the underserved areas of Placer County. He would like to have a Tahoe representative at that meeting
- 5. Lastly he mentioned that there are some behind the scenes meetings at Placer County working to streamline permitting. Also a discussion on how to do better on customer service, wayfinding, etc.
- 6. Sandy mentioned that the area plan committees are meeting tonight at Granlibakken from 6-9pm.
- 7. Mike Young mentioned that the Incline 2020 Vision Plan is meeting next week. Also, that there is a new shuttle from Incline Village to Sand Harbor.






